School Uniform Policy

Garnteg Primary School School Uniform Policy

At Garnteg Primary School we believe in sharing common goals and team work. Working as a whole school team helps to create high standards in performance and whole school conduct. Our School uniform helps create a culture of pride and a sense of common shared goals.

We believe that a school uniform is very important:

- It looks smart
- Wears well
- Contributes to a sense of belonging
- Gives a common purpose
- Fosters a feeling of pride

We ask that all children wear the uniform and we encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

Our school colours are red and grey.

Our school uniform is as follows:

Red sweatshirt, cardigan, sweater, white shirt, grey trousers or grey skirt.

For summer wear as above, or;

White Polo Shirt pinkl/white gingham dress

Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons, bobbles etc. should be fairly simple and if possible in school colours. Make up and hair dying in a range of colours is not acceptable and does not comply with primary schools standards of dress and presentation code.

Parents are asked to ensure that all items are labelled clearly with their child's name.

For safety reasons we ask that the children do not wear jewellery in school. If earrings are worn we request they are study only.

PE Kit

Health and Safety

For health and safety reasons it is important that children are properly dressed for any physical activity. If stud earrings are worn pupils must be able to take them out independently for the duration of their lesson.

Our uniform for PE is as follows:

Indoor

Black/Grey or appropriate shorts for boys

White top and black shorts or appropriate for girls or house colours.

PE kit should be kept in a named drawstring bag

Outside

Tracksuits and appropriate footwear/gear for the appropriate activity in which they are participating in e.g. Football/ Rugby kit.

PE kit should be kept in school and returned home at set times for washing. All items of PE clothing should be named, rugby requires a track suit and a change of clothes.
