# <u>Industrial Action in Schools - Wednesday 1st February</u>

As you are aware the National Education Union has notified schools of their intended industrial action, which is scheduled for

Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2023 Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2023 Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023 and Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2023

Following a risk assessment and consultations with the LA and Chair of Governors, the school will be closed to <u>Class 2 Reception and Class 4 Year 2 only</u> on Wednesday  $1^{st}$  February. At this stage we are unable to confirm the position for other days.

We thank you for your understanding during this time. If there are any changes regarding this, we will of course let you know.

## Important information regarding Fixed Penalty Notices

Dear Parent / Carer,

We are writing to inform you that from 03.09.22 the start of this academic year the school will be issuing Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) again as part of our school and LA strategy to bring our attendance figures back in line with our pre-Covid figures. We have always been proud of our attendance figures in school and would like to take this opportunity to thank parents and carers for their continued support in this area.

Now that we are back to normal with our routines in school, we feel it is essential to continue to strive for excellence and employ as many strategies as we feel necessary to ensure learners are in classrooms all day. We will only issue an FPN as a last resort; usually, issues are resolved with clear home-school communication. However, should we feel that there are no underlying reasons for school absence then the FPN process will be followed.

Fixed Penalty Notices may be considered appropriate when:

- At least 10 sessions (5 school days) are lost due to unauthorized absence during the current academic year. These do not need to be consecutive;
- Unauthorised absences of at least 10 sessions (5 school days) due to holidays in term time or delayed return from extended holidays; or
- Persistent late arrival at school, i.e. after the register has closed, in the current term. "Persistent" means at least 10 sessions of late arrival:

• Truancy, where the child has come to the attention of the Police or public during school hours for being absent from school, without an acceptable reason.

## Registration

Doors are open for Registration at 8.40am and registration takes place in classes at 9.05am, please ensure your child is in class by 9.00am. Both gates are closed at 9.00am. Pupils who arrive after 9.30am will be marked <u>as an unauthorised absence</u> and could be referred to the Education Welfare Officer. A recurrence of late marks throughout any week will also be referred to the Education Welfare Officer.

## Pupil Absence

In the event of your child being absent please telephone/email the school office before 9.30am and give a reason for your child's absence. Please advise us the nature of your child's absence, we have been asked by the Education Welfare Service to contact parents if the message merely states ill, poorly or feeling unwell to establish the illness the child is absent for. All absences will be recorded as unauthorised unless a message is received via telephone/email or class dojo.

Please remember to update us of any changes to pupil contact details, such as change of address, telephone number or email address.

Please do not hesitate to contact school or the Education Welfare Officer if you have any concerns.

## Road Safety Training/Kerbcraft - Year 3 pupils

Classes 6 & 7 will be involved in a weeklong road safety training scheme, week commencing Monday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2023.

The children will be taken out of class, in groups of around 10 children with 2 adults, for 4 on road training sessions, all within easy walking distance of the school, and will discuss crossing the road in safe places, how to cross the road when a safe place cannot be found, crossing near parked cars and crossing at junctions.

We are delighted to introduce our new Play, Wellbeing and Mindfulness Club, working in partnership with University of South Wales.


